Dockweiler State Beach Dedication Celebrates New Facilities

On May 2, 2007, Supervisor Don Knabe celebrated the dedication of the new look of Dockweiler Beach. The Supervisor along with many dignitaries and members of the Dockweiler family participated in this festive ceremony at the sunny shores of Dockweiler Beach.



The \$14 million Dockweiler Beach project, of which \$4.8 million are Proposition A funds, involved the reconstruction, refurbishment, replacement and expansion of various Dockweiler Beach facilities: restrooms, parking lots, entrance facilities, a concession building, life guard facilities, Dockweiler Beach Recreational Vehicle Park, new playground equipment, as well as irrigation and landscaping improvements.



Dockweiler State Beach consists of 3.7 miles of sparkling shoreline from El Segundo to Marina del Rey and welcomes more than three million beach goers every year.
